


MARGERYALBERTINI:

Her artwork explores both internally and externally imposed boundaries and limitations which influence identity. Her recent works use simple household objects such as mirrors and doors to carefully scrape the veneer of domestic security and vanity, revealing uncertainties that churn underneath. Albertini encourages her viewers to "unearth the causes of personal anguish and disenchantment."



ALLISONANDREWS:

Allison Andrews received her MFA in sculpture from VCU in May of 2006. She co-founded Urban Light Works, a non-profit public art organization with international reach. Allison currently resides in Richmond, VA and has exhibited her work locally and abroad.

CHRISBOLDUC:




EDHOLTEN:




GREGKELLEY:
